FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. How do I become a class instructor?

Interested instructors must complete and submit an application along with required attachments. Applications will be reviewed by staff, and interviews will be held with applicants whose applications are approved. Applicants will be contacted via email regarding final decisions.

2. What dates and times will I be teaching?

These workshop series will be offered Thursday evenings, 6:30 - 9:30 p.m.; August 15 - September 19 and September 26 - October 24.

3. What is the deadline for class proposals?

Please submit your proposal by Monday, July 1.

4. How are instructors paid?

Contracted Instructors will be paid by check upon the completion of their course/workshop series and a submitted invoice. If the class moves forward with the minimum of 14 enrollments, the instructor will be paid 80 percent of an 80/20 revenue split of class fees. Final payment is based on the total number of enrolled participants and the class fee.

5. What experience are you looking for?

The Thornton Arts & Culture Division is open to any individual who is comfortable teaching a series of workshops dedicated to theater. Workshop topics can range from learning new dialects, audition prep, voice work, etc. Artists with stage experience are highly encouraged to apply.

6. What should I include in my course outline/syllabus?

Instructors can include any teaching points that are relevant to the subject matter, including techniques, skill development, headshots, etc.

7. Will I have access to a stage?

Yes, the instructor will have access to a small stage located at 9209 Dorothy Boulevard.

8. If chosen, will I be a city of Thornton employee?

Contracted instructors are independent contractors and not employed by the city of Thornton.

9. Will I be able to teach this workshop series again?

Depending on the popularity of the series and feedback from participants there is the possibility of offer workshops again.

10. What if no one signs up for the workshops?

If the class has no enrollment then it will be cancelled. The instructor will be informed of any cancellations or schedule changes in advanced. However, an instructor may choose to continue with the class, knowing that low enrollment will affect the final payment.

11. What is the minimum and maximum number of participants enrolled?

In order for the workshops to move forward we are requiring a minimum of 14 participants. The maximum number of participants is set by the instructor.
